## Polar Express Makes a Stop

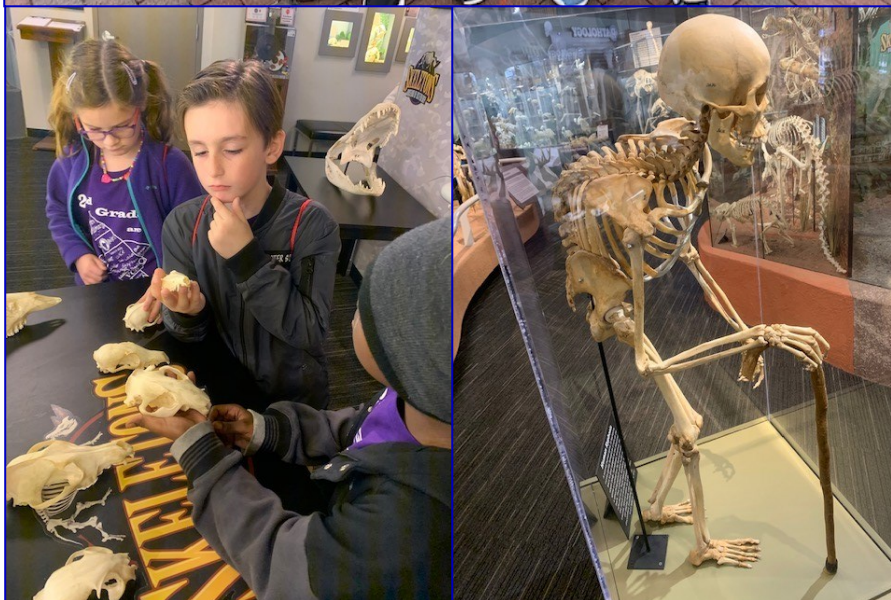

## ***Dream It, Do It!* Writing Club Becomes Daily Activity**

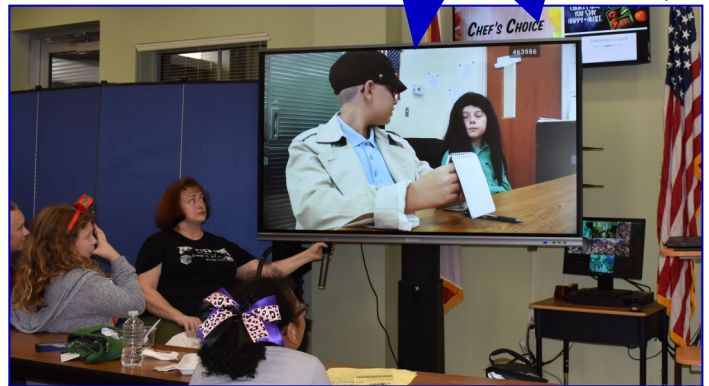
The *Dream It, Do It!* Writing Club has become part of the daily activity wheel so that all fourth-graders and fifth-graders can take part.

The Club taps students' natural love of storytelling and gets them excited about bringing their stories to life on the stage and screen. Students discover a need to "make notes" to create their stories, and then writing becomes a means to an end. From there, screenplay dialog and details must be written for actors to read, requiring more writing. All types of storytelling are covered, from essays, to songs, to funny memes.

Writing teacher Mrs. Gaffey brings a laptop cart to each class and students write their screenplays on laptops, and shoot and edit their own movies on iPads using state-of-the-art Lumafusion editing software.

The traditional *Dream It, Do It!* Writing Club still meets weekly after school. Members will perform their songs and skits and show movies on the new smart board at an April 23 student show.

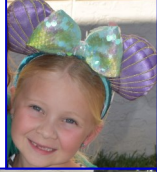
Dr. Spadaccini makes sure they come to talk to eighth graders each year.
