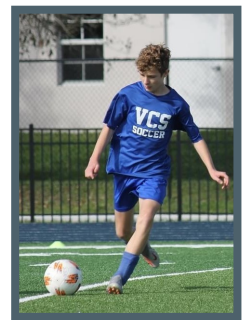
VCS Middle School Soccer

The VCS Middle School Co-ed Soccer Program had an excellent season. It all started with 49 Middle School Student-Athletes trying out and the selection of 28 players on two teams. The A Team included 5 sixth graders, 6 seventh graders, and 3 eighth graders. The B Team included 2 sixth graders, 10 seventh graders, 2 eighth graders. In the regular SCCAA season The A Team had 3 wins and 2 losses while the B Team had 5 wins and no losses. In the SCCAA Championship Tournament the A Team had a great run winning their quarterfinal and semi-final

matches before losing a heartbreaker in the championship game on penalty kicks after tying the score in regulation play. The B Team earned the first seed and a quarterfinal bye with the best regular season record. The B Team lost a hard-fought battle in their semi-final match closing out a stellar season. Both Teams represented VCS well, putting in the time and effort to produce entertaining team play and demonstrating excellent sportsmanship throughout the season.

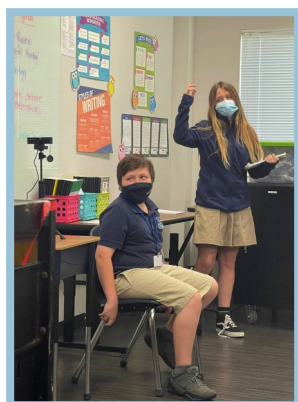
